Under Article 13 (2) c), 14 (2) d), 15 et seq of the General Data Protection Regulation – Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data (the “**GDPR**”), it is our responsibility to provide you with certain information about the exercise of your rights in relation to personal data supplied in connection with your relationship with RPS S.p.A..

Right to lodge a complaint with a Supervisory authority (Art. 77)	Without prejudice to any other administrative or judicial remedy, if you consider that the processing of your personal data infringes the GDPR, you have the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority, in particular in the Member State of your habitual residence, place of work, or place of the alleged infringement.	

The exercise of the above rights is subject to the limitations, rules and procedures laid down in the GDPR, which the Data Subject must be familiar with, and implement. In accordance with the provisions of Article 12 (3) the Data Controller will provide the data subject with information on the actions taken without unjustified delay, no later than one month from receipt of the request. This period may be extended by two months if necessary, taking into account the complexity, and number of the requests. The Data Controller will inform the data subject of the extension, and of the reasons for the delay, within one month from receiving the request.

The exercise of these rights is, on principle, free of charge; the Data Controller may request a contribution to expenses, in the case of manifestly groundless or excessive requests (including repeated requests).

If the Data Controller has reasonable doubts about the identity of the individual submitting the request, further information may be requested, to confirm the data subject's identity.

I have been informed that the details indicated on this form will only be used to reply to the request and will be kept for 5 years as proof of the procedure, for the purposes of potential administrative or legal claims.
